INTRODUCTION

This is a self-help study of the 1st and 2nd Letters of Peter. It was especially written to strengthen believers who were suffering persecution and who had to defend themselves against false teachers.

The Bible is divided into books, chapters and verses. This makes it easy to locate any particular passage. In this study you will find the reference (chapter and verse) to the left of the question, as in the following example:

The answer to this question is found in 1st Peter, chapter 1, verse 2.

Quotations are taken from the New International "Free on the Inside" Version of the Bible. It will be easier to do the study by using this version, although other versions can also be used. The wording may vary but the meaning will be the same.

After reading the passage, answer the question by making a mark beside the correct phrase. If you are uncertain of an answer, mark the one that you think is correct and make a question mark next to it. The person who corrects your study will be able to answer your question or will look for the answer if he or she does not know it.

If you have taken your stand to be with Jesus and serve him, I pray that you will remember the truth about Jesus and not be shaken when trouble and rejection come your way. Be sure that your faith will be tested. Expect it, face it and don't run from it. Christ was not abandoned to the grave by his Father, nor will we be abandoned by God in our time of trial.

LAST TIME EVENTS

There is a certain amount of controversy about Christ's return and the Day of Judgment. I don't want to add to the argument, but point you to the Scriptures that talk about it.

- 1. The teaching about the last things comes from Jesus himself. He said that he would go away and prepare a place for us. Then he would come back to bring us to be with him where he is. Check this out in John 14:1-3.
- 2. Jesus also taught that the city of Jerusalem would be destroyed. Its destruction would be like the Last Day judgment. You can find this teaching in Matthew 24, Mark 13, and Luke 21:5-36.

Before the end comes, the good news of the gospel will be preached to the whole world (Matthew 24:14). Jesus' coming will be seen throughout the whole world (Matthew 24:27). Jesus will gather his chosen people to himself from every corner of the globe (Matthew 24:30-31). Even the dead will hear his voice and come out of their graves (John 5:28-29).

3. No one knows when Jesus will return so we are to be prepared at all times (Matthew 24:36-51). In Matthew 25:1-13 Jesus tells us to be prepared. Then he tells us that he has given us his word and his Holy Spirit (the talents or money) and that he wants us to be profitable for him (Matthew 25:14-30). Those who serve and obey will be rewarded. In the remainder of Matthew 25 Jesus teaches that he will sit on his throne in judgment and separate people like a shepherd separates the sheep from the goats. He will judge us by how we have loved other believers and those who suffer.

Jesus also taught about the judgment in the parables of Matthew 13.

4. Before The End there will be a time of rebellion, lawlessness and great suffering. Paul wrote about this in 2 Thessalonians 1:5-10 and 2:1-12, just as Jesus did in Matthew 24:9-22.

5. The Apostle Paul picks up on Jesus' teaching and explains what it will be like for the dead to hear the voice of Jesus and come from their graves. Paul speaks of the resurrection from the dead in 1 Corinthians 15 where he says that the dead will be raised from their graves and those who are alive at that time will have their bodies changed instantly into immortal, spiritual bodies. We will receive glorious bodies like the resurrected body of Jesus (Philippians 3:20-21; 1 Corinthians 15: 42-44, 50-54).

He teaches the same thing in 1 Thessalonians 4:13-5:3. Notice that Matthew 24, 1 Thessalonians 4 and 1 Corinthians 15 all mention the trumpet call of God. This lets us know that Paul is linking his teaching with the teaching of Jesus.

- 6. Our hope is for the resurrection from the dead and a new creation that will replace this present creation. The present world is subject to the curse of sin (Romans 8:18-25), but in the new world no one will sin and no one will suffer the consequences of sin. This is what Peter teaches in the third chapter of his second letter. This new world is also described in Revelation 21-22.
- 7. Followers of Christ will be with Christ at the moment of their death. Their bodies are buried in the ground, but their spirits are with Christ (Philippians 1:20-24). See also 2 Corinthians 5:1-10.
- 8. Those who follow other gods, serve the interests of this life, and do not follow Christ, will go to the realm of the dead where they will be in pain and torment (Luke 16:19-31). Their bodies will also be raised from the dead. Then they with body and soul will stand before Christ to be judged.
- 9. One of the principles in interpreting the Bible is to hold fast to the basic and clear teaching, but to be flexible when it comes to passages that are hard to understand and are less clear. Once the clear basics are understood, we can interpret obscure and difficult passages so that our interpretation of them fits in with the basics. Once we understand what Jesus and Paul and Peter are saying, we can go on to read Revelation. Revelation uses a lot of symbolism and makes many references to the Old Testament. What follows are passages that speak about the Last Day events.

Revelation 6:9-17: The souls of the martyrs are with God and await the final judgment, the day when their enemies will be judged.

Revelation 17 and 18 speak about judgment that will come to Rome, the city that rules over the Roman Empire. The Roman Empire was rich, powerful, and exploited the peoples over which it ruled. It was also against the rule of Jesus Christ and his followers. This reveals what will happen to every rich and godless empire that rejects Jesus Christ and his rule of love.

Revelation 19-20 speaks in vivid and figurative language about the final battle between Christ and Satan. Satan and all of his followers will be cast into the Lake of Fire at the Final Judgment.

One of the biggest disagreements among Christians is how to interpret the 1,000 years of Revelation 20. Some say that Jesus will return to reign on earth for a 1,000 years. There are many ideas on what this reign on earth will look like. Others believe that the 1,000 years is a figurative number and refers to Christ's reign at the present time. They say that he is reigning from heaven. He governs all things for the benefit of his church and he rules in the hearts of believers who love others as he loved them.

The scope of this study is not to argue about disputable things. The main point is that we must live in such a way so that we please Christ. We don't know when we will die, and we don't know when Christ will return; but we want to be working and living so as to please him because we know that he is present in our lives, homes, place of work and in church. In fact he is living with us through the presence of the Holy Spirit. So at all times we want to be ready for his appearing and for the great Final Judgment—which by the way, is the great day when the full promise of our salvation will be revealed to us and to all mankind. For us who enter, it will be a time of great rejoicing; but for those who have rejected the gospel, it will be a time of anguish and horror to what is to come.
