INTRODUCTION

This is a self-help study of the Apostle Paul's letter to the Ephesians. Paul is urging the church to be united. They could do this because both Jews and non-Jews (Gentiles) were saved in the same way--by believing in Christ. People in the church had all manner of personalities and gifts. They, t00, could live united if they dedicated themselves to building each other up in the faith. In addition, the church had to be united in its battle against the world of sin. For this it needed spiritual armor.

The Bible is divided into books, chapters and verses. This makes it easy to locate any particular passage. In this study you will find the reference (chapter and verse) to the left of the question, as in the following example:
